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Best Practices Around Grading Scholarship Applications

BEST PRACTICES

1. Establish Clear, Transparent Scoring Criteria

- Create a rubric with weighted categories (e.g., academics, leadership, financial need, etc).
- Define what each score (e.g., 1-5) means for each criterion.
- Ensure all reviewers are trained on the rubric to maintain consistency.

- Continuously refine the rubric and review process based on data and reviewer input.
